Spring is just around the corner and planning for summer events is in progress.

Upcoming Events:

- 4-H Congress : Montana 4-H is moving ahead with planning Congress for the MSU campus in July, with some modifications. More information will be coming.
- 4-H Camp: In order to provide a safer environment, the decision was made to split 4-H camp this year. Glacier, Toole, Liberty, Pondera, and Chouteau counties camp for 1.5-2 days, and Hill, Phillips, and Blaine counties camp for 1.5-2 days. Camp will be June 14 17, 2021. More information will be coming as soon as the schedule is set. Counselors will be there for all four days. Thank you to Jordan Leach, Ty Backen, Martin Fulbright for volunteering to serve as camp counselors this year.

Marias Fair Updates:

The 2021 Marias Fair starts on Wednesday, July 21, 2021.

Lower Valley Processing, our processor for lambs, pigs, and goats, is overbooked, so will not be able to process animals this year. Vandevanter Meats in Columbia Falls has agreed to process those fair animals for us. They also process Teton and Cascade county 4-H animals, with great reviews. Members with spare animals should make arrangements to process spare animals soon, as processing schedules are tight.

The hog weigh-in deadline is April 11th. Remember the minimum weight to be able to sell at the Marias Fair is 220 pounds.

The lamb/goat weigh-in deadline is May 9th. Minimum weight for lambs is 100 pounds and 70 pounds for goats.

Fair Entry Registration: Since we no longer have an account with 4honline you will have to create a new FairEntry account. If you participated in the State 4-H Shoot you had to create a Fair Entry account. You will use that information for the Marias Fair registration as well. More information will be coming, so stay tuned.
