Three of the five, presented Wednesday night, are 1) All county boards, commissioners, and committees appointed by the county commission shall be established by a separate ordinance, (with seven requirements); 2) the chief executive be given the right to veto ordinance.

tions from eligible citizens.

The next public hearing will be 7:30 p.m. April 18 in the court-house courtroom, when two additional charter amendments will be presented regarding the county attorney and the chief of law enforcement.
