CHARTER OF PONDERA COUNTY PREAMBLE

WE, the people of Pondera County, State of Montana in accordance with Article XI. Section 5 of the Constitution of Montana, do adopt this charter.

ARTICLEI GENERAL PROVISIONS Section 1.01 - Powers of the County

(1) The County of Pondera, Montana shall have all powers not prohibitied by the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of Montana, the laws of Montana or this Charter.

(2) The County of Pondera may levy property tax in an amount not to exceed the maximum, including the all purpose mill levy and special levies, allowable by law to a county with general government powers.

(3) No new kinds of taxes may be imposed by the commission without an affirmative vote of the people. This shall not be interpreted to prevent the use of service or utility charges or fees or occupational licenses or similar charges or fees.

Setion 1.02 - Interpretation of

The powers and authority of this self-government unit shall be liberally construed. Every reasonable doubt as to the existence of that power or authority shall be resolved in favor of the existence of that power or authority.

Section 1.03 - Oath of Office

Before entering upon the duties of office, all elected county officials shall take and subscribe to the following oath of office: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support. protect and defend the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of Montana, this

(8) In the event of vacancy, the commission shall by majority vote of the remaining members, appoint a person. eligible to hold such commission seat, to fill the vacancy until the next regular county election at which time the remainder of the term shall be filled as provided

(9) The commission shall be the judge of the election and qualifications of its members and of the grounds of forfeiture of their office. A member charged with conduct constituting grounds for forfeiture of his office shall be entitled to a public hearing on demand and notice of such hoaring shall be published in a manner consistent with state law.

Section 2.02 - Powers and

(1) The County Commission shall be the legislative and policy-determining body of the County. All powers of the county shall be vested in the Commission, except as otherwise provided by law or this charter, and the Commission shall provide for the exercise thereof and for the performance of all duties and obligations imposed on the County by law.

(2) All members of boards. other than temporary advisory committees established by the manager, shall be appointed by the commission, except as provided by ordinance. All committees and boards shall exist no longer than four (4) years, at which time they shall be subject to review and reconsideration. If such committee or board is found necessary it may be reappoint-

ARTICLE IV COMMUNITY COUNCILS Section 4.01 - Elected Community Councils

(1) Community Councils of three (3) members each, shall be elected within each district to advise the commissioner from that district. Such council members shall serve without monetary compensation.

ARTICLE V ELECTED OFFICIALS Section 5.01 - Election, Terms, Compensation, Vacancy, Re-

(1) The following county officials shall be elected. After the establishment of any office the commission may consolidate as provided by law two or more of the offices.

(a) a legal officer (who may be called the "county attorney"); (b) a law enforcement officer

(who may be called the

tributed among such departments, agencies and offices as are established by this charter or may be established thereunder by ordinance of the county commission in order to execute and enforce policies as are determined by the commission and to carry out obligations imposed on the county by state law. Section 6.02 - Coroner

(1) A coroner shall be appointed by the county commission, or in place of such appointment the functions and duties normally assigned to the office of coroner shall be assigned to one or more other county office.

(2) The coroner shall perform all duties charged to him/her by this charter, law, ordinance or resolution.

(3) Compensation shall be determined by ordinance. Section 6.03 - Public Administrator

(1) A public administrator shall be appointed by the county commission, or in place of such appointment the functions and duties normally assigned to the office of public administrator shall be assigned to one or more other county offices.

(2) The public administrator shall perform all duties charged to him/her by this charter, law. ordinance or resolution.

(3) Compensation shall be determined by ordinance.

ARTICLE VII INITIATIVE, REFERENDUM AND RECALL Section 7.01 - Initiative

Initiative and referendum powers and procedures, as reserved to the people by the Constitution of Montana, shall be as prescribed by state law. Section 7.02 - Recall

Any or all of the elected officials provided for in this charter may, be removed from office by the electors. The

officers as provided in this Form of Government. section. All legislative, execuand duties of the local government not specifically reserved by law or ordinance to other elected officials, shall reside in the Commission. The commission shall appoint the heads of departments and other employees, except for those appointed by other elected law, ordinance or resolution. officials.

(2) The plan of government shall further define the structural characteristics of the form by including the items listed helow:

(a) The Commission shall be nominated by districts in which candidates must reside and which are apportioned by population, but elected at large.

(b) Local government elections shall be conducted on a partisan basis as provided in this title.

(c) The chairman of the commission, who may be referred to as the "mayor." shall be the presiding officer of the commission. All members of boards and committees shall be appointed by the chairman with the consent of the commission. The chairman shall be recognized as the head of the local government unit and may vote as other members on the commission. The chairman shall be elected by the members of the commission from their own number for a term established by ordinance.

(d) The commission may appoint one or more administrative assistants to assist them in the supervision and operation of the local government.

(e) Commission members shall be elected for overlapping terms of office.

(f) The size of the commission shall be three (3) members, and community councils to advise commissioners may be authorized by ordinance.

(1) The Charter form consists tive, and administrative powers of an elected commission and a manager appointed by the Commission who shall be the chief administrative officer of the local government. The manager shall be responsible to the Commission for the administration of all local government affairs placed in his charge by

(2) The manager shall be appointed by the Commission for an indefinite term on the basis of merit only, and removed only by a majority vote of the whole number of the commission.
