4-H Vehicle License Plates

Have you noticed vehicles driving around with a 4-H specialty license plate on them? There are some, but if you haven't seen any this is an awareness notice to let you know, 4-H Specialty License Plates exist and they are available for anyone in Montana, the 4-H plate requires an administration and production fee to the county and a \$20 yearly fee. The \$20 yearly fee goes entirely to the 4-H program. The 4-H plate has been available in Montana since 2002 but many people do not know they exist. Those of you who are interested in supporting the 4-H program and would like to have the 4-H license plate on your vehicle, remember to purchase one the next time you relicense your vehicle.

Treasury balance is low, as usual for this time of year. A \$4000 grant was received for fair improvement projects. Rec Lab reimbursements will be about \$900 less cost of fuel travel expenses.

Reports

- Rec Lab attendees each had an amazing time. Ambassador meeting is coming up, dance is planned for May 9th.
- Livestock committee plans to paint the swine, sheep, and horse barns, plus adding dirt in the steer barn and leveling out the arena. Looking into electric updates.
- StirUps Senior winners were Jayden Cook and Alida Feiro, and Junior Samantha Hofstetter. Top Junior demonstrators were Katherine Wrobleski (first), Moriah Champneys, Ailie Avilla, Anaelle Avilla. - County 4-H Scholarship Interviews are the second week in April; four graduates will interview.
- Meat Raffle tickets were given to club leaders. Each member is asked to sell 10 tickets; stubs and payments are due any time until Fair Readiness Day, the prize cutoff day. More tickets will be sold at the fair. Tickets offer a chance for ½ hog (two available), 1/8 bison, ¼ beef, or one Dorper lamb.
