# ABOUT FAIR READINESS DAY

Fair Readiness Day is held yearly on the Saturday before the Sanders County Fair, beginning at 9:00am. It is a time when all Sanders County 4-H members come together to prepare the buildings on the fair grounds for fair. Fair Readiness Day activities include cleaning buildings Sanders County 4-H uses during the fair.

### **Buildings that need cleaned include:**

**Beef** 

Pavilion

Poultry

Sheep/Goat/Llama

Swine

Rabbit

If you are able to, please consider bringing cleaners, rags for cleaning, buckets, a wheelbarrow, rake, broom or anything you think may help in the cleaning process. Be sure to put your name on anything you bring.

- **Members with 4-H Exhibits:** Members who will have 4-H exhibits in the fair, but not animal exhibits, please go directly to the Pavilion to find out what you can do to help.
- <u>Barn Clean-up:</u> Barns must be cleaned, shavings hauled in, grass pulled, etc. as appropriate for the barn. When you arrive at the fair grounds on Fair Readiness Day, members who will have animal exhibits in the fair go directly to the barn(s) where you will have animals housed. Check in with the barn superintendent to find out what you can do to help. If your help is not needed at that barn, consider going to another barn you will have animals in.
- **Entry Cards:** You may pick-up your entry cards for all 4-H exhibits you plan to enter in the fair from your club organizational leader at Fair Readiness Day. If you haven't received your entry cards by the end of Fair Readiness Day, be sure to contact your Organizational Leader prior to the fair to receive them. You must bring an entry card with each exhibit you bring to the fair this does include entry tags for animal showmanship events, besides all other articles being exhibited.

### REMINDERS FOR EXHIBITING AT THE FAIR

#### **Attention Photography and Cooking Members:**

Please refer to the email sent to you from juli.thruston@montana.edu on August 13 for guidelines on exhibiting your entries at fair. Highlights of the message are below.

- All **cooking** items must have a recipe with the entry (including James, jellies and canned items (using a paper plate in a Ziploc baggie) and other information.
- In *photography* the email explains to you how to display your pictures, what size poster board to use, and to attach a Photography Exhibit Information Card to each exhibit. Remember, in photography we are looking for technique, not a picture of a specific item such as a boy in blue or girl in pink.

**4-H Members with Animals**: When checking in on Wednesday with the vet, be sure to have your animal Health/Vet Inspection Card. Record books will not be checked at the fair, but we encourage members to have them up to date. This will help you to prepare for your interviews at the end of the year. All record books must be turned in to club organizational leaders by September 11.

**Stall Signs/Decorations:** There is no need to prepare stall signs or decorations. We will still be using the paper stall cards for market livestock given when you arrive.

**Shows:** Shows will be open to members and their families - not the general public.

**Round Robin:** No Round Robin competitions will be held this year.

**Awards Ceremony:** The awards ceremony held on Sunday morning is cancelled and awards will be given out at your club's November meeting.

### 2020 Static 4-H Exhibit Registration Thursday, September 3

Members entering static 4-H exhibits (non-animal) and pocket pets in the fair must drop off their indoor exhibits at the 4-H Pavilion on Wednesday, September 2 from 1:00 - 7:00 p.m. There will be designated tables set up according to projects. Indoor exhibits will be judged on Thursday, September 3.

**Entry Tags:** Members who submitted their fair exhibits online will receive entry tags for their fair entries from their club leader.

- Entry tags will be given to Organizational Leaders on Fair Readiness Day. Securely attach cards to your exhibits so they are easily visible.
- Bring all your exhibits to the Pavilion so you can register them. Exceptions include animals, animal project posters, animal notebooks & animal educational displays which stay in the animal barns.
- Again, Pocket pet exhibits are the only animal exhibits judged in the Pavilion.

### SUGGESTIONS FOR ANIMAL PROJECT MEMBERS FROM VETERINARIAN:



- It is highly recommended for members to cool animals down before traveling, especially the swine!
- Remember to have your Animal Health Vet Inspection form(s) completed and ready to give the Veterinarian when you check in your animal(s) at the fair. You must have a form for each animal.
- If an animal has not been administered a required vaccine they will not be allowed to show.
- Please make sure your animals are vaccinated as listed in the Animal Health Schedule. If an animal has not been administered a required vaccine they will not be allowed to show.

Electric Clippers purchased by the Sanders County 4-H Livestock Committee are available for 4-H use only to be checked out for three days at a time with a \$20.00 deposit. The borrower will receive back \$10.00 after returning them in good clean condition within three days. The remaining \$10.00 will apply to any up-keep/repairs the clippers may need in the future.

**Photographs** of market animals will be taken immediately following the individual livestock shows. Members please have your exhibitor number visible to the camera (**worn on your chest**) in the photograph for identification purposes. Please remain in show clothes for the photograph.

### Remember to express your appreciation to your buyer with a personal thank you.

We understand the buyers much prefer being thanked personally by the members and receiving a gift from them. With that in mind, all market members are asked to mail a thank you gift, or deliver it to the buyer after the fair. **The gift should be around \$10 in value. Examples include, but are not limited to:** a picture frame, a coffee mug w/ candy in it or with a 4-H coffee bag, a water bottle, a hot pad or trivet, or an item hand made by the member. Baked goods are not recommended for a variety of safety reasons. The livestock committee will not be providing thank you gifts.

If you need your buyers address the Extension Office will have it available for you.

After fair you will receive a copy of the thank you the Extension Office sent to your buyer.



### Families Checking in Animals at Fair on Thursday, September 3

When bringing your animals to the fair on Thursday please follow the route below to enter the fairgrounds and to get to the spot you need to check in your animals. The intent is to alleviate congestion. Turn in by the pavilion and travel behind the main rodeo arena and then over to the barns.

Remember, do not bring animals to the fair prior to 1:00pm Thursday and no later than 7:00pm Thursday



### OUTSTANDING MEMBER COUNTY AWARDS

Outstanding Member County Awards are given to 4-H members who have done and outstanding job in a project area or in the 4-H program overall (above and beyond what the minimum requirements are). Members or Leaders may nominate any member(s) you feel meet that criteria. Members may also apply for an outstanding member county award. Be sure those hard working members are rewarded for their outstanding efforts!!

Nomination/application forms will be emailed to 4-H families prior to fair and are available at the Extension Office, from your Organizational Leader, or at the fair where the Extension Office is set up. Members must complete their projects and 4-H year (complete their record book) to qualify for an Outstanding Member County award. Nomination/application forms must be given to the Organizational Leader or that members club no later than Friday, September 11th.

### Member's Complete Record Books

After the fair is over, members be sure you complete your project records to include results from the fair. Then turn your completed record book into your club Organizational leader by Friday, September 11. If you're not completely sure about completing your records, review the past 4-H Dispatch Newsletters from December 2019 through February 2020 that included very helpful record keeping guidelines. If you still have questions contact one of your club leaders or the Extension Office for help. Completing your records is what completes your 4-H year.
