Preparation Prior to the Fair



ABOUT FAIR READINESS DAY

Fair Readiness Day is held yearly on the Saturday before the Sanders County Fair, beginning at **9:00am**. It is a time when all Sanders County 4-H and FFA members come together to prepare the buildings on the fair grounds for fair. Fair Readiness Day activities include cleaning buildings used during the fair.

Buildings that need cleaned include:

- Beef
- Home Ec (houses exhibits that are not animals)
- Horse
- Pavilion (Since the Pavilion houses the 4-H Dining Hall, it needs spruced up too!)
- Poultry
- Sheep/Goat
- Swine
- Rabbit

If you are able to, please consider bringing cleaners, rags for cleaning, buckets, a wheelbarrow, rake, broom or anything you think may help in the cleaning process. Be sure to put your name on anything you bring.

- **Members with 4-H Exhibits:** Members who will have exhibits in the fair, but not animal exhibits, please go directly to the Home Ec and Pavilion buildings to find out what you can do to help.
- <u>Barn Clean-up:</u> Barns must be cleaned, shavings hauled in, grass pulled, etc. as appropriate for the barn. When you arrive at the fair grounds on Fair Readiness Day, members who will have animal exhibits in the fair go directly to the barn(s) where you will have animals housed. Check in with the barn superintendent to find out what you can do to help. If your help is not needed at that barn, consider going to another barn you will have animals in, or check at the Home Ec Building and the Pavilion to see what help you can provide at either of those buildings. They all have to be cleaned and prepared for fair.
- <u>Entry Cards:</u> You may pick-up your entry cards for all exhibits you plan to enter in the fair from your club organizational leader or FFA instructor at Fair Readiness Day. If you haven't received your entry cards by the end of Fair Readiness Day, be sure to contact your Organizational Leader or FFA Instructor prior to the fair to receive them. You must bring an entry card with each exhibit you bring to the fair this does include entry tags for animal interviews and showmanship events, besides all other articles being exhibited.
- <u>Camping Passes:</u> Those camping in the Camping area and are working a Barn Patrol shift may pick up their camping passes from the fair office 9:00am-Noon on Fair Readiness Day or from Johnny Thurston, Camping Coordinator, Tuesday evening August 31, 5pm-9pm or Wednesday morning 8am-10am when checking in with him to place your camper or tent.
- <u>4-H Meal Plans:</u> Find Ashley from the Extension Office at Fair Readiness Day to purchase your 4-H Meal Plan (greatly discounted from the general public meal prices).



What to Bring to the Fair

The following list was compiled to help you prepare for the fair.

Please contact the Extension Office if you have questions about any of the items, or suggestions to add to the list.

*indicates required items

Clothes:

- Appropriate summer clothes for Thursday interviews
- Warm clothes for Rodeo night, the trips to barns, bathrooms and breakfast
- Flip flops for the shower
- Your own personal grooming aids toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, brush, soap, deodorant, towels, shampoo
- Hair ties or scarves for kitchen duty shift

Projects:

- *Fair entry tags for each exhibit
- Something to transport your projects from the car/camper to barns; e.g. wheelbarrow, wagon, all your non 4-H friends
- First aid kit for projects: Extra poster board, art supplies, tape, permanent markers, etc. for projects that receive damage in route to fair.

Animal Project Members:

- *Long sleeve white shirt and dark pants are REQUIRED for animal shows
- Rubber boots and rubber apron for wash rack
- Work boots and show boots
- Market Sale (Sunday): Nice shirt, clean jeans and boots

Animals:

- *Vet Health Inspection form(s)
- Feed for 5 days and feed containers. **Swine Members:** Be sure your hog knows how to drink out of the self-waterer, otherwise bring peanut butter to teach it.
- Posters to place above stalls/cages with information about your project animal
- Staple gun, hammers, nails, wire, rags
- Decorations for stalls/cages to match the rest of your club
- Spray bottles for cooling animals/old towels to get wet for cooling down animals, sun screen for animals
- Tarps for shading pens
- Rakes/shovels/wheelbarrow for cleaning pens and stalls
- Bridles/halters
- Shampoos/grooming aids for washing animals
- Buckets

Campers:

- Games to play while not taking care of animals
- Lawn chairs
- Tarps in case of rain
- Snacks and lots of water
- Books, puzzles, music
- Bug spray/sunscreen
- First aid kit for you
- Solar lights to help prevent people from tripping over your camp at night
- Wasp/yellow jacket traps

Why do meal plans cost so much?

One of the goals of the 4-H Dining Hall is to provide low cost wholesome meals to 4-H families at the fair. We are able to do that through the 4-H meal plans, which do little more than cover the cost of meals. If you will take a look at the breakdown of meal prices you will see how much each meal will cost if you don't eat the full number of meals on the plan. Each year we receive some complaints that the meal plans are nontransferrable, meaning only one person cat eat from a plan. Siblings cannot share and husband & wife cannot share. The reason for this has been that the meals were being subsidized and the Council was actually losing money on the meal plans. Now you might think that sharing should be an option since each meal plan almost covers the cost of the meal, but that will not be the case. This is why: The meal plan covers the average cost of a meal. Breakfast will be less expensive than the average and dinner will be more expensive than the average. If a family of 5 were to share a 5 meal plan for dinner, the 4-H Council would actually lose money on that meal. Again, it is important that we at least recover the expenses of the food with the meal plan. We realize that this may make purchasing plans expensive for your family, but please know that the 4-H Council maintains the meal plan prices out of necessity and to cover expenses. No great profit will be made from 4-H meal plans. *4-H families please purchase meal plans from a staff member

of the Extension Office at Fair Readiness Day, or purchase

them in the dining hall during the fair.

REMINDERS FOR EXHIBITING AT THE FAIR

Attention Photography and Cooking Members:

Please refer to the email sent to you from juli.thruston@montana.edu for guidelines on exhibiting your entries at fair. Highlights of the message are below.

- All **cooking** items must have a recipe with the entry (including James, jellies and canned items (using a paper plate in a Ziploc baggie) and other information.
- In *photography* the email explains to you how to display your pictures, what size poster board to use, and to attach a Photography Exhibit Information Card to each exhibit. Remember, in photography we are looking for technique, not a picture of a specific item such as a boy in blue or girl in pink.

Members with Animals: When checking in on Wednesday with the vet, be sure to have your animal Health/Vet Inspection Card. Record books will not be checked at the fair, but we encourage members to have them up to date. This will help you to prepare for your interviews. All record books must be turned in to club organizational leaders by September 16.

All Entries will be released to be taken home at 6pm on Sunday, September 4. Don't forget to pick up <u>all</u> of your entries from the location where they were displayed.

2022 FAIR REGISTRATION & INTERVIEWS THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 1

Members entering static exhibits (non-animal) and pocket pets in the fair must register at the fair and interview for each entry. The registration desk is located at the east end of the Home Ec Building. **Registration and Interviews will be Thursday, September 1, 1:00 - 4:30 pm**. To allow members more flexibility, we do not have a specific schedule for clubs to register. Members must register and interview for all project exhibits within the 1:00-4:30 time frame except for animal entries. Pocket pets are the only animal projects that are registered and interviewed in the Home Ec Building. Please try not to wait too late to register so the judges may be completed with interviews by 4:30. Your best efforts in this matter will be greatly appreciated!

Entry Tags: Members who submitted their fair exhibits online will receive entry tags for their fair entries from their club leader.

- Entry tags will be given to Organizational Leaders on Fair Readiness Day. Securely attach cards to your exhibits so they are easily visible for the public to view.
- Bring all your exhibits to the Home-Ec Building with you when you register. (Exceptions include animals, animal project posters, animal notebooks & animal educational displays which stay in the animal barns)
- Again, Pocket pet exhibits are the only animal exhibits judged in the Home Ec Building.

- Please make sure your animals are vaccinated as listed in the Animal Health Schedule. If an animal has not been administered a required vaccine they will not be allowed to show.

We understand the buyers much prefer being thanked personally by the members and receiving a gift from them. With that in mind, all market members are asked to mail a thank you gift, or deliver it to the buyer after the fair. **The gift should be around \$15-\$20 in value.**

Examples include, but are not limited to: a picture frame, a coffee mug w/ candy in it, a water bottle, a hot pad or trivet, or an item hand made by the member. Baked goods are not recommended for a variety of safety reasons. The livestock committee will not be providing thank you gifts.

If you need your buyers address the Extension Office will have it available for you.

After fair you will receive a copy of the thank you the Extension Office sent to your buyer.

Newspapers may contact you about purchasing a thank you advertisement. You are not required to buy one but you may if you would like. A portion of your sale assessment fee pays for a thank you ad in both the Sanders County Ledger & Valley Press. This ad recognizes all businesses and individuals who purchase an animal at the Market Livestock Sale.

As you can see there are still shifts that need people to patrol the barns. The sign-up deadline is Wednesday, August 10th, but if your child is entering an animal in the fair and you are able to work a shift, please call the Extension Office to get on the schedule. Thanks!

Thanks to all of you who have volunteered to take an active part in assuring the safety of the animals and barns.

FYI for New Livestock Families

- Adult(s) of families with livestock at the fair are asked to work a two-hour shift during one of the fair nights patrolling the barns at the fairgrounds.
- Sanders County Fair Commission provides a free camping pass for those who are on Barn Duty and wish to camp at the fairgrounds.
- People who volunteer to patrol must be at least 18 years old.

Pick up Camping Passes:

- From the Fair Office on Saturday, August 27th (Fair Readiness Day) 9:00 am 12:00 noon or
- From Johnny Thurston, Barn Patrol Coordinator on Tuesday evening, August 30th 5pm-9pm or Wednesday morning 8am-10am when checking in with him to place your camper or tent.

Parking Campers at the Fairgrounds

Families arriving with campers on Saturday, August 27th must park their campers west of the horse arena.

Barn Superintendents & Assistants may park their campers in the camping area beginning at 4pm on Tuesday, August 30th.

<u>After</u> checking in with Camping Coordinator, Johnny Thurston at the camping area families who have signed up for barn patrol may park campers or set up tents in the camping area Tuesday 5pm-9pm or Wednesday 8am-10am.

This is NOT a process of "get there early to get your spot"!

Please do not plan to arrive with your camper/tent after 10:00am Wednesday. This should allow for less congestion while checking the animals in at 1:00 Wednesday. Please do not plan to check your animal(s) in prior to 1:00 Wednesday.

Camping Coordinator, Johnny Thurston will:

- Show you where to place your camper or tent.
- Provide you with your camping pass.
- Provide you with an updated Barn Patrol Schedule
- Provide you with the Camping Code of Conduct form for you to sign and return to Johnny.
- Please follow the above procedures to prevent confusion and ensure the safety of all. Creating areas for fire lanes is essential while placing campers and tents.

Important Notices

- For safety reasons, the two vehicle gates entering the livestock area will be closed for any traffic Wednesday at 10:00 p.m. No vehicles will be able to come in or go out of that area until Sunday at 6:00 p.m. All campers, etc. requiring vehicles with them should be in the camping area no later than 10 a.m. Wednesday morning.
- Everyone signed up for Barn Duty is expected to fulfill their responsibility. **Please do not miss working your shift**. Missing your shift runs a risk of the animals' safety in the absence of someone patrolling or may force another person to take on 4 hours of patrolling instead of their scheduled 2 hours. Remember, you are receiving a **FREE** camping pass due to the 2 hours you have signed up for. If you fail to perform your barn duty shift, the fair office will invoice you for full-service camping for the week of fair.
- There must be an adult responsible for anyone under 18 years of age while camping. In respect to all who are camping "Quiet Time" is 10pm to 6am every night. Abiding by all guidelines included in the Camping Code of Conduct is essential.
- Power provided in the camping area is for lights ONLY. There is not enough amperage available to drive air conditioning units, refrigeration units or other electrical items which draw large amounts of power
 - Quiet generators may be operated to provide power to your camper.
 - You must provide your own generator.
 - Generators may not operate during guiet hours.


