Project Manuals

It is important members use the project materials listed in the Clover for each project area they participate in. While selecting projects to enroll in through ZSuite, the program provides a drop down list of manuals to select for each project.

Be sure to click on which project materials the member needs.

If you are not sure what is needed refer to the "Clover, Montana 4-H Project Selection Guide" or call the Extension Office. Every 4-H family should receive a Clover from your Organizational Leader. Families are responsible for the price of their child's project materials. The Extension Staff will generate an order of project materials from what the 4-H families indicated they need through ZSuite. Families will then be invoiced for the project materials and will be expected to pay for them when materials are received.

All members are expected to journal all they do in their 4-H projects and 4-H club work. Those journals must be included in their record book.

- Enter a minimum of 6 exhibits in a Food/Nutrition project at the fair
- Complete an interview for exhibits submitted at the fair
- Provide an updated record book for judges to review for growth in the project at the fair

- · Saturday lunch numbers decreased, will discuss prior to spring.
- · Cook requests a raise. Livestock committee will discuss, council will address at December meeting, possibly offer bonus decided annually.
- Pricing for meals is adequate. Encourage people to ask for larger servings if they wish.
- Cook suggests closing 30 minutes earlier on rodeo nights.

Ambassadors held dance at fair, attendance up from last year, well received.

- Dances are picking up traction, helped with forest days and AG days events. Will emcee Achievement Day. Will attend fall leadership training third week of October, and help with open house on October 16.
- Would like to speak at club meetings to recruit more ambassadors (sixth grade and up.) Current Ambassadors are Mikiah and Melodie Cook, Anna Hafner, McKinzie Tulloch, Andrew and Claire Wrobleski.

Fair Projects: Home Ec Building is beautiful!

- Thanks to all assisting the remodel, especially Johnny Thurston and Bruce Beckstead
- Needs wood sealing, painting on cooler, wooden clovers for decoration, window frames.
- Restroom heater worked well, difficult to adjust temperature in current location. Sinks in girls' restroom need work, possibly need new countertop. Mirror on the shower side would be nice, maybe take down each year. Beer garden patrons do use the restrooms. Knobs and latches will be installed on girls' side. New drain in stall was helpful, and hot water on-demand was great. Need new shower curtains every year. Lock on storage room in pavilion is great, new stoves are a hit, working on a grant for a cooler.

Meeting called to order at 6:30 pm

Minutes from August Meeting: Approved

Treasurer's Report: Report given - Balance \$4,859.76

Old Business:

Fair Improvements:

Ideas: Ryan is working on the Jason Hanna sign and will look at the goat pen gates that need to be repaired. Doug/Whitney hope to do some updates in the Rabbit/Poultry Barn.

Wendy will follow-up on horse arena tie rail. Hot Springs FFA said they could do the tie rail.

Hot Springs FFA has agreed to add feet to the show arena and outdoor horse/beef panels so they don't sink.

Horse Barn water upgrades were completed. Rabbit/Poultry Barn drain pit and new poultry pens were completed.

New tin on swine barn. Juli got a bid for \$11,000 to replace roofing and rotten boards underneath. We will also look into other bids/grants.

Paint, sand and stain bleachers in 2023. Or purchase new bleachers? Juli will look into pricing.

Consider sand added to the show arena again in 2023. Tammy will call Alan when the panels are out.

Horse wash rack – 2023 – Pat/Mindi/Michele getting bids.

Permanent light at beef photo booth? Move or get a photo backdrop? Discuss this after we see how this year' pictures turned out. New pig boards and water nipples are needed. Alan will look into cost to make them.

Meat Raffle Report – 25% of sales to livestock committee \$3,658. Yes, sale tickets at fair next year but sale tickets and draw for winners at the sale.

New Business:

Sale Report - Highest sale yet \$202,034. Still collecting about half of the sale funds from buyers.

Pay Council for Superintendent meals? \$825 for all meal plans or \$458.25 for actual meals eaten. Tabled until conclude if the kitchen made a profit.

Archie McDonald Nominations – a winner was determined

Ask FFA to help with cost of ribbons/thank you ad/tank pumped/vet fees/etc. - An estimation of expenses was

requested by Tammy. Juli will get that to her and it will be discussed at the next meeting.

Livestock Policy Changes? – wording for shirts, possibly cap sale weight for steers at 1500 lbs., increase sale withholding by \$5/species

Fair review/suggested changes -

Move sheep interviews to 5:30pm before swine wash racks get busy

Discussed other award possibilities vs trophies

If free rodeo tickets get moved to Thursday vs Friday, still request swine members get theirs on Friday
