

The Facilities Capital Improvement Plan (FCIP) met today and had a long discussion of the funding mechanism surrounding two projects in the county; the law and justice center and the fairgrounds. At this time, movement has been put on hold for the law and justice center due to current funding concerns. While they address the law and justice center and other projects, they will start on the fairgrounds because the funding around that facility is available. The committee is going to meet again next Thursday to develop a plan moving forward, not a meeting to decide on actual buildings and such, but looking at the funding of each component. It was said in this meeting today by commissioners that we will not be displaced for fair in 2023 or moving forward.

The Beartooth Humane Alliance (BHA) Hay Bank Program

BHA maintains a hay bank for horse owners who are experiencing a financial hardship and cannot pay for feed for their animals. The program provides quality hay at no cost for up to 30 days. Applicants need to prove a genuine need and have a plan to feed their horses after the 30 days of assistance has ended.







NEED HELP WITH HAY THIS WINTER?

The purpose of the Beartooth Humane Alliance Hay Bank is to assist private horse owners residing in Stillwater County who are experiencing a financial hardship with free hay for their horses. The Beartooth Humane Alliance Hay Bank is donation driven and hay is provided at absolutely no cost to qualified recipients.

The Beartooth Humane Alliance Hay Bank will provide qualified Stillwater County applicants with hay for their horses, ponies, donkeys, or mules in the event of a financial hardship or a crisis. It is not intended to be relied upon on an ongoing basis. A qualifying financial hardship or crisis includes, but is not limited to, job loss, medical bills or other hardships.

The Beartooth Humane Alliance Hay Bank was established to serve private horse owners, not equestrian businesses, equine rescues, or 501c3 organizations.

Applicants need to not only have a genuine financial need for assistance, but they also need to devise a well thought out plan for how they will get back on their feet and manage their horse care after the 30 days of Hay Bank assistance has ended. It's perfectly appropriate to use those 30 days to responsibly re-home or sell your horse if you have determined you can no longer afford your horse(s) long term



Awards Committee - Haley asks that the committee gather for input on what changes need to be made, if any, for Fair awards and offers an open invitation to anyone who would like to help with the Awards Committee. Contact Haley if interested.

Market Beef Policy - Lee asked for discussion/clarification regarding the rule "A 4-H member may sell in the Live Auction any projects that receive Grand and/or Reserve Champion awards."

- What is the intent of the rule for future Fairs?
- Initial concern is Beef Projects. In the past a member can show two beef projects but only sell one. With the wording of the new rule, both beef could technically be sold in Live Auction if they receive Grand and Reserve Champion awards.
- As far as the Live Auction goes, a 4-H member has the potential of selling twelve animals and two indoor projects, depending on what projects the member enrolled in.
 - Do we need to cap the number of beef per member?
 - o One beef per member?
- The importance of marketing for the Live Auction sale and thanking all of our supporters from the county level, club level and individual level is crucial in keeping our Live Auction a success.

After discussion, it was agreed that if a 4-H member has that much drive to have that many projects for Fair and receives Grand and Reserve Champions on all those projects, no need to discourage them by limiting the number of Live Auction entries.

Fairgrounds Brainstorm Discussion - Haley and Lee asked all parties present to weigh-in on the Pros and Cons for a physical Fair Location for 2023 & 2024 as the current location may not be available/accessible with current construction plans. Brainstorming Headings included: using Sweetgrass County Fairgrounds, Carbon County Fairgrounds, Temporary Tents at new fairground location, push for Building New Fairgrounds Now, Other Ideas. Haley and Lee will compile information from the brainstorming session and move forward to the next step for planning.

At 7:58pm, Brian Young moved to adjourn the meeting, Tammi Kirch seconded the motion.
