



IN AN EVACUATION SCENARIO ONE OF THE MOST COMMON REASONS GIVEN FOR FAILURE TO EVACUATE IS BECAUSE A PET IS IN THE HOME

– Don't let an emergency turn into a disaster – PLAN AHEAD!

THE 24PETWATCH PET OWNER'S EMERGENCY CHECK LIST

- ✓ Be Prepared. Emergencies come in many forms, from house fires to floods, earthquakes and tornadoes
 you will be in a hurry so the key is to be prepared.
- Identify your home as a pet residence with a window decal for the emergency response team included with EmergencyCare Insurance.
- ✓ Put a Collar on your pet with ID tag, city license tag and rabies tag.
- Microchip your pet to ensure permanent identification in the event that your pet loses its collar.

- Water for 3 days plus dish. As a rough guideline; I large bottle for a cat or a small dog and I large bottle per day for a medium/large dog;
- Hard shell pet carrier (for a cat or small dog) labeled with key information include pet's name, microchip number and 24PetWatch telephone number (personal information may be included but is unnecessary if the pet is microchipped);
- Leash and well fitted muzzle (for a medium/large breed dog) in a disaster situation your dog, no matter how good natured normally, will be fearful. We strongly recommend the use of a muzzle during this stressful period to ensure that your pet is safely manageable by both you and by strangers;
- Medication if your pet requires medication on an ongoing basis you should include 3 day's supply in a water/airtight container. In the event that you become separated from your pet it is important for veterinary personnel to be able to access your pet's medical records. 24PetWatch Medical is a unique program, that allows your pet's medical records to be securely housed and accessed online via 24PetWatch database;
- Pet first aid kit this should include absorbent gauze pads, absorbent gauze roll, conforming bandage, cotton tipped applicators, antiseptic wipes, antiseptic cream, tweezers, scissors and disposable gloves;
- Cat litter box and litter or plastic bags to dispose of dog waste;
- Blanket
- Identify a Safe Haven In the event of a wide-scale evacuation, many human shelters will not accept pets because of health and safety regulations. If you live in an area prone to certain natural disasters like flooding, tornadoes or earthquakes it is important to locate a safe haven for your pet ahead of time.
