


2024 Golden Triangle 4-H Volunteer Summit

9:30 - 10:30 Workshops

- · Record books, project books, and resources This session will walk through how to use books throughout the year to encourage learning, how they can promote problem solving and independent thinking, and the incredible value of teaching recordkeeping. Kari Lewis and Lisa Terry will share resources for club and project meetings, along with recordkeeping examples.
- Fine Time for Swine! Rose Malisani will share basic selection, nutrition, and management for leaders to assist beginning families, and will share on the Swine of Excellence program.
- Tech Tools for 4-H Leaders Join Kim Woodring to learn the basics of navigating Zsuite to check record books, communicate with families, social media Do's and Don'ts, 4-H branding and marketing, and more to increase your efficiency and effectiveness as a volunteer.

10:30 - 11:30 Workshops

- Cultivating a 4-H Community Susan Snyder, longtime Teton county 4-H leader and 4-H alumni, will share practical ideas for encouraging family engagement, creating an inviting club, and instilling club best practices in members for record books, communications, and community service. This session will also highlight opportunities available beyond the county level.
- Helping Create Success in the Livestock Project Courtnee Clairmont of CHS Nutrition will share how to help youth livestock members set appropriate goals for their project, determine how much to feed, how to compare various feeds for cost effectiveness and performance, and help youth meet their livestock show goals.

Glacier County FSA Youth Loans

If you are looking for a way to finance your 4-H projects for this year, consider visiting with the Farm Service Agency. They recently increased the loan limit to \$10,000 and funds can be used for the purchase of animals, feed, supplies, etc. Youth between the ages of 10 and 20 are eligible. Loans are repaid annually and can be termed out for up to seven years for the purchase of breeding stock. The interest rate is currently 5.25%. "The Night Check" Series

MSU Extension- Cascade County is offering a FREE webinar series called, "The Night Check" in November 2024. The webinar series will help cattle producers learn about preparing for calving season, calf care, scour prevention, colostrum, and purchasing bred heifers versus cows.

- The second webinar will be on Friday November 8th at 12:00pm with Dr. Megan Can Emon who is
 the second MSU Extension Beef Specialist and based out of Miles City. Megan will talk about
 feeding before and after calving season, balancing rations, and nutrient requirements for bred
 heifers and cows.
- The third webinar will be on Friday, November 15th at 12:00pm with Dr. Rachel Endecott with Grey
 Horse Consulting and Goggins Ranch. Rachel will discuss buying bred heifers versus cows and the
 pros and cons.
- The last webinar will be Friday, November 22nd at 12:00pm with Dr. Hannah DelCurto-Wyffels who is a MSU professor and based out of Bozeman. She will discuss preparing for calving season, stages of calving, intervention, and postnatal care.

New Volunteers - Clover Academy Volunteer Orientation

New volunteers will need to complete a volunteer orientation in Zsuite. Each module usually takes about 15 minutes. We cannot finalize your leader status until this orientation is completed.

UPCOMING EVENTS

Beef Weigh-Ins

The minimum weight for 2025 Marias Fair is 1,100 pounds; max pay weight is 1,500 pounds, select steers accordingly. Each exhibitor may weigh in one spare animal/species. If doing a pen of three, four market animals may be weighed in. Any breeding animals must have the 4-H Clover tattoo OR Association registration tattoo OR Bangs vaccination tattoo by the official hog weigh-in deadline (which will be in April 2025). So, if you are doing a breeding project, your animal does not need to be weighed in at steer weigh-in but must have an appropriate tattoo by April.

All steers must be dehorned before weigh-in, as horned steers are NOT allowed at the fair. Also, ensure your steer has been fully castrated and is not a stag. All steers must have been born after January 1, 2024. 4-Her must be 10 as of Oct. 1 to show a market beef animal.

Information to bring to weigh-in: Steer's birth date Breed of steer (including percentages of each breed) Breeder's name and mailing address

Beef members, as you are purchasing steers, please be sure to get a Bill of Sale as this will be needed at the fair. Unless the steer is from the 4-Her's immediate family (father/mother), they need to have a Bill of Sale indicating a Change of Ownership. A Bill of Sale IS needed if purchasing from cousins, uncles, aunts, grandparents, neighbors, etc. They are also encouraged to have a Show Cattle Permit as well for transportation purposes. At the Marias Fair weigh-in in July, 4-Hers will be asked to sign a "ranch raised affidavit" if their steer is from their family.

If you have any questions on what is needed or need to get a Brand Inspection, please call Jeff Jergens, district brand inspector, at 406-450-0001, or local brand inspectors Chad Scarborough at 406-470-0712 or Tom Seifert at 406-873-5700. Please bring your Bill of Sale to December weighins so that we can make sure you have it. We will try to have some extra Bill of Sale forms available at our December weigh-ins if anyone needs as well.
