REFASHIONED/REPURPOSE/REDESIGN

This class allows you to repurpose or alter clothing or textile items and show off your work. Members will be judged, and awards given. Your item(s) will be worn in the Public Review or displayed. Include a narrative and before and after pictures of your item.

The State 4-H Refashioned Contest has the following guidelines. Be sure to follow these if you are a senior 4-H member and want to try and compete at State 4-H Congress.

- At least one clothing item that has been repurposed into a significantly different wearable garment or look.
- A photograph of the original clothing item is required to be brought to the judging.

CLOVERBUD CLASS

This class is designed to allow Cloverbuds to share and/or model items they have sewn or purchased. Cloverbuds can also sign up for the other categories. Include a narrative and picture of your item.

EMBROIDERY - KNITTING - CROCHET

This class is for items that members have made in their embroidery, crochet or knitting project that can be worn. Members will do an interview and model in the Public Review. Include a narrative and picture.
