BEGINNER CONSTRUCTION TECHNIQUES

Elastic or draw string waistband	Seam finishing (edge, pink, zigzag)
Grading, clipping, notching	Interfacing
Patch and in-seam pockets	Decorative machine stitching
Handling trims (may include pre-gathered	Sewing on hooks, eyes, snaps, and buttons
lace, bias trims, or other flat trims. Ribbed	
knit trims are excluded.)	
Under stitching	Stay stitching
Velcro closures	Top stitching

Garments in this level should not have gathers, buttonholes, or set-on waistbands. Basic trims may be used. Do <u>not</u> use plaids, stripes, or fabrics requiring matching in beginning sewing. Fabrics with one-way designs should be cut in the same direction.
