MONTANAFAIR CAMPING SPACE RESERVATION REQUESTS - ONLINE ONLY

All requests for MontanaFair Camper/Trailer reservation will only be accepted electronically. We do not accept calls or emails for reservations. The electronic process can be easily accomplished on a computer, laptop or smart phone (we have tested it on all devices) - anywhere you have internet access.

Online reservation requests will open at 8:00 am on Monday, April 1st. All requests will be recorded, and date and time stamped once you have completed all questions and hit the "Submit" button.

The link will be posted on the Yellowstone County 4-H website under the MontanaFair section. The link will not work until 8:00 am, Monday, April 1, 2024. The <u>link to make a reservation request</u> is: <u>https://montana.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_8ADVIkDjYyZ5218</u>

<u>PLEASE BE PREPARED TO PROVIDE THE ACTUAL LENGTH of your camper/trailer when making the reservation</u>. If length is not actual, and camper/trailer will not fit the assigned camper space based on the information you are providing, you may not be accommodated.

Only 4-H and FFA members exhibiting in Department A and N at MontanaFair and MontanaFair 4-H officials may request a camper space. A limited number of spaces are available on a first requested, first filled basis.

Completing a request does not guarantee a space reservation. Requestors will be notified in late June/early July of their request status via a letter, contract, and invoice.

Full hookups for the week cost \$75. Dry camping is no charge, but a reservation request and contract is required. Metra requires completed contracts and payment be delivered to the Extension Office (301 N 27th Street, Suite 330, Billings, MT 59107 - DO NOT mail to Metra) by August 1, **BEFORE** placement of your camper. Campers/trailers can be towed for lack of contract or payment. Those not in compliance will be towed. <u>Please be a good patron and camping neighbor</u> while using MetraPark facilities.

ATTENTION! ENROLLMENT DROPS & ADDS MUST BE MADE BY APRIL 30

ALL members and volunteers enrolled in 4-H have access to their records through ZSuite and will be solely responsible for adding, dropping, and verifying the accuracy of their projects include the level of the project. Members may make changes to their PROJECTS up until April 30, 2024, after which time the online program will be locked and NO changes can be made to projects. **No exceptions**!

Verifying the accuracy of projects and levels is very important as it can affect your MontanaFair entries and eligibility.

Please access your ZSuite profile and add and/or drop projects in your enrollment. To do this you will choose to "Update Enrollment" and then click on the CLUBS tab. Click on the green box "Add projects". After selecting <u>each</u> project, you want to add, click on the blue "add project". When you have finished adding all desired projects be sure to click on the pink "submit" box at the bottom to save all added projects. If you wish to drop projects, locate the Project name you want to drop. To the right of the project name, you will see an "X" to click on. A box will display asking for confirmation to delete the project. Click on the red "yes" box to confirm deletion of the project. After deleting the project(s), be sure to click on the pink "submit" box at the bottom to save all changes.

4-H AND WHAT IT STANDS FOR. *REMEMBER TO INCLUDE THE DASH* BETWEEN THE 4 AND THE H!

We would like to remind everyone what the four H's represent. When writing about the 4-H program <u>don't forget</u> to include the dash between the 4 and the H.

The 4-H pledge represents what each member and leader stand for. Below is a break down by Michigan State University Extension of the pledge and how it relates to youth.

The first "H" in 4-H stands for Head; "Head to clearer thinking." One of the key concepts in 4-H is education; allowing youth the opportunity to learn new things through projects and programs. 4-H allows youth to be actively engaged in their own learning. In addition, 4-H makes youth participants, rather than recipients, in the learning process. One of the main goals in 4-H is for youth to develop life skills that help them succeed. Some of these life skills include leadership, responsibility, dedication, communication, and self-confidence.

The second "H" in 4-H stands for Heart; "Heart to greater loyalty." In 4-H, youth are taught to be reliable and loyal in their heart and understand what is means to take responsibility for their projects and to follow through. 4-H also gives youth positive relationships with adults and peers through leaders and teens. Caring for others and their projects is also a trait that relates to the "H" for Heart.

The next "H" in 4-H stands for Hands; "Hands for larger service." 4-H'ers are busy with their hands all year long learning new things and caring for their projects with hands-on experiences. Another way 4-H'ers use their hands is by giving back to the community. Part of 4-H is teaching youth the importance of serving the community, country, and world.

The last "H" in 4-H stands for Health; "Health to better living." Knowing how to cook and grow food, and appreciating art allows 4-H'ers to gain an understanding of how the world works and how to live healthy. Projects such as photography, canning, arts, and crafts, sewing, collections, and cooking help youth realize what it takes to have a healthy lifestyle and how to spend their leisure time. 4-H also strives to make sure youth are physically and emotionally safe.

By putting all the "H"s together, we get the 4-H pledge:

I pledge, My **Head** to clearer thinking; My **Heart** to greater loyalty; My **Hands** to larger service; My **Health** to better living, For my club, my community, my country, and my world.

National Volunteer Week takes place April 21-27, 2024. National Volunteer Week was established in 1974 and has grown exponentially each year, with thousands of volunteer projects and special events scheduled throughout the week. Today, as people strive to lead lives that reflect their values, the expression of civic life has evolved. Whether online, at the office, or the local food bank; whether with a vote, a voice, or a wallet – doing good comes in many forms, and we recognize and celebrate them all.

STATE AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIPS

May 1, 2024, is the due date for State Awards application. Members who are 14 and older as of October 1, 2023, are eligible. The Montana 4-H State Awards program is in place to recognize the outstanding accomplishments of 4-H members who have reached a standard of excellence in a variety of project and activity award areas. State Award winners have gone above and beyond regular project work with a focus on leadership, communication, and community service. 4-H members may self-nominate. Members can view sample award applications on the <u>state 4-H website</u> at <u>https://www.montana.edu/extension/4h/programs/awards/state-awards.html</u>

If a member is selected as a state winner, they are eligible to attend National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia, November 2024.

There can be more than one winner in a project, or activity area. A member can apply in any project or area; an application must be completed for each project or area in which they want to be considered. State award selection committees look for excellence in 4-H work, leadership, citizenship, and community service. All state award and scholarship winners are announced at State 4-H Congress in July.

To apply for state awards, members must use the Montana State 4-H Awards application. You can get an application off the <u>Montana State 4-H website</u> or <u>http://www.montana4h.org/programs/awards/state-awards.html</u>

4-H ADULT AWARDS

The Montana 4-H Foundation and 4-H Center have consolidated the award nomination for adults into one form. The awards categories are:

Tribute to Volunteer Excellence Awards: The 4-H Center will recognize individuals from each 4-H District in two award categories. The Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer recognizes individuals who have served as 4-H volunteers for 10 years or more. The Volunteer of the Year recognizes individuals who have served as 4-H volunteers for less than 10 years. **Hall of Fame Award**: The 4-H Foundation honors individuals such as community leaders, alumni, former or current directors or former or current staff for their outstanding lifetime efforts to generate opportunities for 4-H youth by giving, volunteering, or community support of 4-H.

Outstanding 4-H Alumni Award: The 4-H Foundation recognizes 4-H alumni who have made a significant impact on 4-H by promoting, supporting, and enhancing the benefits of youth and adult involvement in the program or a specific 4-H project area.

OPPORTUNITY TO ATTEND 4-H CONGRESS IN JULY

Were you 13 years old by October 1, 2023, and are interested in attending 4-H Congress in Bozeman this July? This statewide gathering focuses on leadership development and personal growth. The event includes competitions for state project and contest awards.

The following briefly describes the activities and events that are available to participate in at State 4-H Congress. Some have county participation requirements. Please read them carefully. 4-H State Congress will be July 9-12, 2024. **Demonstration** - You must have received a blue ribbon at the county Communication Day contest. We may take any number of competitors.

<u>Career Communication</u> - You practice the skills of applying for a job including an application, cover letter and resume. Contact Roni if you are interested in this opportunity.

Public Speaking - You must have received a blue ribbon at the county Communication Day contest. We may take any number of competitors.

Fashion Revue – You must have participated in county Showcase event. We may take more than one participant. Selection is made at the county Showcase event.

Horse Judging - We may take a team of four. Contact Roni if you are interested in being part of this team.

<u>Livestock Judging</u> - We may take a team of 4 or individual members to compete in judging classes and giving reasons. Contact Roni if you are interested in this opportunity.

<u>Stir-Ups Contest</u> - This is a fun, challenging food program where members plan a meal, prepare a low-fat main dish, display the meal, and create a notebook. We can take individuals or teams. Contact Roni if you are interested in this category.

<u>Gavel Games</u> - This is a Parliamentary Procedure contest. Teams of four compete. Contact Roni if you are interested in this category.

<u>Quilting</u> - Quilts judged at the county Showcase event are eligible to attend Congress.

Horse Skillathon - A team of four can compete in this contest about horse knowledge. Contact Roni if you are interested in being on this team.

<u>Video</u> - Learn communication skills through creating, editing, and presenting a video. Contact Roni if you are interested in this category.

4-H members interested can attend as a delegate (a member of age wanting to attend) or by competing in Career Communications, Demonstration or Illustrated Talk, Fashion Review, Gavel Games (Parliamentary Procedure), Horse Judging, Horse Hippology (Skillathon), Livestock Judging, Public Speaking, Quilt Contest, Stir-ups, or Video. 2024 YOUTH TRAPPER CAMP-FUN FOR THE FAMILY

Are you taking the wildlife project or just like animals? The camp is geared towards family participation. Campers will attend classes on trapping methods, ethics, regulations, fur handing, heath, and safety. Camp instructors come from the MTA education Program and Montana FWP.

Camp will be held June 14-16, 2024, in Augusta, MT. Cost is \$50/camper. Limited scholarships are available to the first 60 youth registrants who request help prior to April 15.. Applications are accepted on a first come, first accepted basis by May 15.

NATURAL RESOURCES YOUTH CAMP

For 38 years, the Montana Natural Resources Youth Camp has provided youth an opportunity to study in an outdoor classroom. We invite youth aged 14-18 and 13 (if graduated from eight grade) to spend one week in the rustic setting of Lubrecht Experimental Forest east of Missoula and learn about Montana's natural resources. The accommodations are comfortable, the food is great, and the instruction and friendships are the best.

Today's scientific principles, economic realities, historical heritage, and social perspectives help these future leaders in their quest to gain natural resources a perspective that is informed and progressive. Campers learn about forests, streams, soils, geology, rangeland, wildlife, and recreation and spend half-day rafting the Clark Fork River's Alberton Gorge. In between the field sessions, professionals who volunteer from various natural resources-based agencies and industries, specialty evening programs, guest speakers, hands-on learning-through-discovery and campfires provide for a lasting summer camp experience.

SKILLATHON – REGISTER IN ZSUITE

Skillathon will be held in conjunction with small animal judging on Saturday, May 11, 2024, in the 4-H Building at MetraPark. Large and small animal skillathon will be available to participants. We begin at 8:30 and run until Small Animal Judging (also held in the 4-H Building on May 11) is finished. An alternate date of May 9, from 3:00-6:00 pm is available for 4-H related conflicts only. Skillathon and animal judging are required if you intend on entering Dept A All Around at MontanaFair. You do not have to enter All Around to participate in the Skillathon. Registration will open April 15 in ZSuite under the "Events" section in your household account. Registration deadline is May 3

A Skillathon or "Livestock Learning Laboratory" is an excellent method of involving youth in challenging, learn-by-doing activities. The purpose of the Skillathon is to evaluate member knowledge, their skill in applying that knowledge and their attitudes and understanding of the knowledge and projects. It is designated in a series of mini-learning stations with a facilitator at each station. Members rotate from station to station, attempting to perform specific tasks. There will be an interview/scoring judge at each station. Twenty points will be available at each station. You must sign up for Skillathon on your Department A Fair entry as Division 3, Class (select) 1–6.

SMALL ANIMAL JUDGING CONTEST — REGISTER IN ZSUITE

2023-2024 ANIMAL QUALITY ASSURANCE POLICY & WORKSHOP SCHEDULE * *NEW GUIDELINES*

All 4–H and FFA members exhibiting any animal in Department A (Junior Livestock) at MontanaFair are required to attend an MSU Extension **ANIMAL QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING (AQA)** (per state guidelines) provided by the 4-H Committee or an FFA Advisor/Agriculture Educator prior to the first MontanaFair entry deadline or exhibitors do not show. Yellowstone County has two 4-H age brackets for AQA training. Exhibitors must attend AQA as Beginners/Juniors (4-H age 8-13), and as a senior member (4-H age 14-19). This age is based on the exhibitors "4-H Age" – the age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year. Exhibitors must take Animal Quality Assurance the first year they reach each age bracket or the first year they are exhibiting in an animal project. All classes will include the same teaching materials and use the same forms and paperwork. Class content is determined by a committee and updated every two years. A parent or legal guardian must also attend the AQA Training.

There will be hands on, group activities. Please plan on arriving on time with a parent with both staying for the complete 1½ hours. If you and your parent are not in attendance for the <u>complete</u> training, you may be asked to attend another session. Plan on attending a session early in the year so conflicts do not occur in your family schedule. **More workshops will NOT be added after the June 19 class. It is the final opportunity for 2024.**

The sessions in January and May are face-to-face at this time at PAYS. For the virtual sessions, people will log into the Webex meeting (Webex link information will be sent out via email prior to each session) to learn the information then go to the online program, pay their own \$12 fee, and take the online class. A copy of the completion certificate must be provided to the Extension Office.

MSU EXTENSION 4-H HORSE HELMET POLICY & WORKSHOP SCHEDULE

Participants in the 4-H Horse Project are required to attend a Horse Helmet Workshop once as a beginner/junior 4-H member (8-13) and again as a senior 4-H member (14 and up). This age is based on the exhibitors "4-H Age" – the age as of October 1 of the current 4-H year. Exhibitors must attend a Horse Helmet Workshop the first year they reach every age bracket or the first year they are exhibiting in an animal project. A parent or legal guardian must also attend the Horse Helmet Workshop.

After attending a 4-H Helmet Workshop, riders may choose whether they will wear a certified helmet. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the 4-H member to see that the headgear worn complies with such standards and is in good condition. The Montana 4-H Center for Youth Development encourages the use of ASTM certified/SEI approved safety helmets in all equine events. Protective headgear may be used in all classes and shall not be discriminated against. Helmet use is encouraged in all 4-H horse activities any time a 4-H member is around a horse. A certified equestrian helmet with safety harness fastened in place is required in over fence classes and gymkhana events, activities, and practice sessions. Gymkhana refers to horseback speed events (timed or un-timed) that do not use livestock. Events that usually fall in this category include, but are not limited to: barrel racing, pole bending, keyhole races, stake races, rescue races, pony express race, etc. Events that are not intended to be included in this policy are events such as calf roping, team roping, goat tying, and team penning that may be timed but use livestock. **More workshops will NOT be added after the May 4 class. It is the final opportunity for 2024.**

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
