REGISTER FOR THE 2023 CLOVERBUD CAMP

Registration for the July 18, 2023, Cloverbud Camp "Water World: Under the Sea." is now open. Registration is to be completed by signing into your households ZSuite account and going to the "Events" page.

Plan now to make this camp part of your summertime fun! The camp fee is \$5 and covers snacks, lunch, supplies and accident insurance.

Please plan to have your Cloverbud at camp by 9:30 am and picked up by 3:00 pm. Dress in appropriate clothing for the day (sunscreen, hat, jacket, and tennis shoes). Please pack a second set of clothes – the kids will get wet! Activities are planned for both indoor and outdoor.

Pre-registration/payment is required and due by Wednesday, July 5, at 5:00 pm. Payment must be made by cash or check and mailed or delivered to the Extension Office @ 301 N 27th St., Billings, MT 59101.

MONTANAFAIR ENTRIES ARE COMPLETED ONLINE- PLEASE READ

MontanaFair entries are completed online at the MontanaFair website or https://www.montanafair.com/.

Department A and Department N MontanaFair Handbooks can be found online at www.montanafair.com and on the County website. For those of you without internet capabilities you can come to the Extension Office and use a computer to complete your online entry.

All 2023 entries must be completed and submitted online <u>before</u> 5:00 pm Friday, June 30 to avoid a late fee of \$50 per exhibitor. Late entries must be completed and submitted online before 5:00 pm Friday, July 7.

All late fees must be paid via a check made payable to Yellowstone County 4-H Council and mailed or dropped off to the Yellowstone County Extension Office by 5:00 pm Friday, July 14.

There are no exceptions to any above deadline.

MontanaFair will assess a \$20 exhibitor fee when you enter online. This \$20 fee will be paid online with a credit or debit card. If you wish to pay via check, the check for exhibitor fees <u>MUST be delivered to MetraPark</u> (<u>NOT</u> the Extension Office).

Parents of exhibitors need to purchase gate admission tickets online as they enter the exhibitor in classes. Tickets are \$6 each and will be paid before submitting the entry. Tickets will be printed by MetraPark and included in the exhibitor packets at 4-H/FFA check-in starting on August 7 at Department N Interview Judging Day in the Expo. Enrolled leaders will complete the Yellowstone County 4-H Volunteer/Project Leader Participation Requirement Form to determine the number of tickets they will receive for gate admission at MontanaFair.

Department A and N Entry worksheets can be printed off the <u>Yellowstone County 4-H website</u> at https://www.montana.edu/extension/yellowstone/4h/index.html

Completing the worksheet in advance can help make your online entry quicker.

Reminder - you can only enter in projects in which you are enrolled - that includes all livestock projects.

Open Class entries and other Department entries must also be completed online. Those classes have separate deadlines and fees.

Be sure you have entered what you want to before you send your entry form electronically. <u>Please write down your exact</u> sign on information - you will need it if you need to make changes to your entry.

Print a copy of your entry form so you know what you have entered.

In Department N (non-livestock), and Department A (livestock) members may lose their premium money if they scratch more than 4 items they entered.

Please visit the Yellowstone County website for the Department N and A schedules for both departments. Some things may be added (e.g., club workshops).

If you plan to enter a livestock showmanship class, you MUST put it on your entry - you cannot add it at fair. The divisions you can enter are beginner, junior or senior.

All Yellowstone County pre-fair events must be included in your Department N (Showcase, Communication Day) or Department A (Cat Show, Dog Show, Skillathon, Small Animal Judging) online entry. If your pre-fair county events are not listed on your entry, you will not receive premium money for those exhibits.

Members wishing to participate in the Quiz Bowl need to enter individually. Teams will be made randomly.

2023 MONTANAFAIR THEME & STICKER CONTEST

We are holding the fair sticker design contest again! We need your entries! For the past 3 years we have had a 4-H Fair Sticker for each youth exhibitor that entered the MontanaFair.

The overall theme for MontanaFair is "The last best place of summer". There is not a specific theme for 4-H /FFA. Use your imagination to design a sticker for this year. Your sticker design needs to be 3"x3". Designs must be submitted to ronibaker@montana.edu by June 30. Winner receives a \$50 gift card.

MONTANAFAIR EXHIBITOR WRISTBANDS

Gate 1 (the back gate 4-Her's use) at Metra will require everyone to have a wristband or ticket to enter the fair. They will enforce entrance requirements. All 4-H and FFA members with entries in MontanaFair will receive a 9-day wristband to enter the fair every day.

Members can pick up their MontanaFair packets on Dept N judging day, August 7, between 8:30 am and 7:00 pm in the Expo building at MetraPark. This will enable you to have your wristband ahead of time.

CLUB BOOTH SET UP

Clubs can set up on Monday, August 7 during Interview Judging from 8:30 am to 7:30 pm and Wednesday, August 9 from 4:00 to 8:00 pm. (JB/12/8/11)

*All loose hanging decorative CLOTH materials shall be flame retardant treated and marked in an inconspicuous but consistent location. **Plastic draped tablecloths do NOT meet the flame spread rating and are NOT acceptable for backdrops.

HOSPITALITY CLASS AT MONTANAFAIR

Everyone is encouraged to participate in the Hospitality Class at the fair. Sign up for this class in your online entry. (Reference page 17 in the Department N Handbook). 4-H members signed up in the Hospitality class can come to Department N to bake pre-mixed cookies, microwave popcorn and trail mix. Members provide ingredients and other necessary items to prepare trail mix or popcorn. An oven and sink are available. Be sure to sign up for a time slot during Department N Interview Judging Day (Monday, August 7).

Members do not need to be in a foods project and can be any age. 4-Her's sign up for the time they wish to come to the fair to bake. Members need to make enough to serve approximately 20. Food will be served to people visiting the 4-H department.

ICE CREAM BOOTH REMINDER

Every TWO-hour shift should have 7 workers (2 adults and 5 members). Please do not have a new set of workers coming in every half an hour. These are two-hour shifts. A limited number of gate passes will be available for workers.

DEPARTMENT N INTERVIEW JUDGING DAY MONDAY, AUGUST 7

Everyone who enters Department N (non-livestock) for fair will need to be at Interview Judging Day, Monday, August 7. Bring all non-livestock entries to the Expo Building Small Bay. 4-H clubs are scheduled either for the morning or evening. **Please note**: there are restrictions for check-in times.

If you come at a time other than your scheduled time, you will wait until all scheduled clubs are finished being judged - unless special arrangements have been made prior to August 7 with Roni Baker and/or the Department N Superintendent Chris Martin. If you have more than 25 exhibits, you ARE REQUIRED to come in the morning, even if your 4-H club is scheduled for the afternoon shift.

ABSENTEE EXHIBITOR FORM FOR INTERVIEW JUDGING DAY

If you entered in Department N, but are not able to attend Interview Judging Day on Monday, August 7, you need to:

- Fill out one "Absentee Judging Form" per project, (not per entry).
- Find a 4-H member who is willing to bring your entries and the Absentee Judging Form(s) to the fair and take them to the specific project judge. They need to take entries in each project(s) along with the form to each project judge.
- Absentee members may choose to talk to a judge via a phone call or FaceTime. Absentee member is responsible for coordinating call(s) or FaceTime with their 4-H member helper. When the helper reaches a judge, they will use their own phone to place the call or use FaceTime to reach the absentee member.
- Arrange to have your entries picked up on from MontanaFair.

You can get the Absentee Interview Judging Form(s) from the Extension Office or on the county 4-H website.

INTERVIEW JUDGING DAY INFORMATION FOR CLUB VOLUNTEERS

Department N requires each club to have one adult member assigned to work on Interview Judging Day during their club's session in one of the areas listed below. We have received the name of each club's adult volunteer.

- Directing members to the registration table, tagging, and holding area.
- Sit at tagging and ribbon tables to monitor and assist Junior Coordinators.
- Sit in foods area to monitor and assist organization of food in refrigerators.
- Take carts back and forth between the entrance and tagging area and help with loading and unloading.
- Making sure kids are not leaving the assigned area.

Each club's adult volunteer must check in when they arrive at the Expo. Please remember, this job is to help make the day run smoothly so the kids get the most out of judging day! A lot of the work will simply be helping the Junior Coordinators as well as the clerks. Thank you for your willingness to help.

MONTANAFAIR COMMUNICATION CONTEST

4-H members who sign up to do a demonstration at MontanaFair can hold their demonstration anytime between noon to 8:00 pm Saturday, August 12-Saturday, August 19. On Saturday, August 19 your demonstration must be finished by 4:00 pm. Tell a Department N clerk when you arrive, and they will help you get set up. You must have been judged at your County Communication Day to enter the Fair Communications Contest.

ALL CLASS JUDGING

You do not need to be enrolled in a specific project to enter All Class Judging. In All Class Judging, participants will be judging any Department N category. This will take place on Friday, August 18, from 12:00-2:30 pm.

QUIZ BOWL

This year the date and time for Quiz Bowl is Sunday, August 13, at 6:30 pm in Department N. Members use a buzzer to answer 4-H related questions presented by a moderator. You must sign up on your Fair Entry Form to participate.

MONTANAFAIR SHOWCASE & AWARDS

The MontanaFair Showcase will be held on Tuesday, August 15 at 6:30 pm. We will be using the scripts from the County Showcase. Outfits to be modeled in Ready-to-Wear must be included in your online entry and you must take them to Interview Judge Day. You must have been judged on the outfits at your County Showcase to enter MontanaFair Showcase.

The Annual Awards Program and refreshments will be held on Tuesday, August 15 at 6:30 pm. The Showcase and the Awards Program will be held in the Expo Large Bay Arena.

4-H DEPARTMENT N BEST OF CLASS NOMINATONS

Buy a Piece of 4-H: Anyone who is nominated for Best of Class during Interview Judging and wants to sell that item can put their item in the Buy a Piece of 4-H area in Department N.

Members must price their item to be sold during the week. The fair clerks will keep track of items as they sell. Each 4-H member can sell two items. Items will be picked up by the purchaser on Saturday or Sunday or delivered to the buyer by the 4-H member.

LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE MEETINGS

The Small Animal Committee meeting will be held on July 26, at 6:00 pm in the Expo. MontanaFair details will be the main topic of business. Sale Committee will meet at 6:30 pm followed by the Livestock Committee. The Department A Post MontanaFair Meeting will be Wednesday, September 6, at 6:00 pm in the 4-H Building.

Sale Ethics and Sale Promotion:

Do you realize that some businesses have as many as 20 or 30 youth asking the owner or manager to attend and support the sale? It is obvious these businesses cannot purchase all the animals. There are many other businesses that are not approached by any 4-H sellers at all! Ask a new business this year. You never know, they just might say yes! Remember, ask the owner or manager to SUPPORT THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE by attending and bidding. This leaves a positive, lasting impression of the 4-H program on the potential buyer.

COSTUME ANIMAL PARADE

The Costume Animal Parade will be held on Wednesday, August 16 at 6:30 pm. You are encouraged to enter. Forms to write your narratives are available at the 4-H Junior Livestock Office. These are due at the 4-H Junior Livestock Office in the Expo by 6:00 pm on Wednesday, August 16.

SMALL ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

On Thursday, August 10, Poultry and Rabbit (cavy may check in today also) check-in at the Expo from 10:00-12:00 and 3:00-4:00 pm. They may also check-in on Friday, August 11 10:00 am-12:00 pm and 1:00-4:00 pm. Cavy check-in on Saturday, August 12 from 7:00-7:45 am. Pocket Pets check-in on Friday, August 11 from 1:00-3:30 pm. You may check-in your animals and decorate your club space or just decorate you club space.

Poultry and rabbits must be checked-in and in their cages by 4:00 pm the day they check-in to be eligible to show. Cavy must be checked-in and in their cages by 7:40 am on Saturday, August 12 to be eligible to show. Pocket Pets must be checked in and in their cages by 3:30 pm on the day of check-in to be eligible to show. Please have your animals ready to be inspected and **KNOW which animal is registered for each class**. This will make the check-in process much easier and faster for everyone. The small animal mandatory meeting is at 4:00 pm, Friday, August 11 in the Expo followed by the Pocket Pet show at 5:00 pm.

MontanaFair has guidelines for everyone's safety; most are common sense and common courtesy. NO SMOKING in barns; NO PUBLIC PARKING inside the fairgrounds; keep barns clean and neat; NO DUMPING of water outside of barns or doorways. Use DRAINS provided. Use dumpsters provided for dirty sawdust.

You will have to provide your own containers. (Tuna cans work well, paper cups do not). Bring your own feed, grooming supplies, buckets, or containers for water. EACH CLUB OR FAMILY should bring; a short-handled hoe, (works for cleaning cages), broom, flat shovel, and wheelbarrow for cleaning and hauling sawdust. A first aid kit for animals and humans, for those minor scrapes, bruises and headaches is also recommended. PLEASE MARK your items with a family name or club name.

As soon as the barns open in the mornings, people start coming through them. The MontanaFair gates open to the public at 11:30 am. For your convenience and less interference from the public, your animals and cages need to be taken care of before 10:00 am. If possible, the animals should be checked again in the afternoon and late evening. They should always have fresh water. Not necessarily because they need it all the time, but the public thinks they do, and they let us know immediately when an animal is out of water, whether it needs water or not.

SMALL ANIMAL REMOVAL will be as follows:

Pocket Pets: Friday, August 11 after the show Cavies: Saturday, August 12 after the show

Poultry and small animals: Sunday, August 13, after the poultry show or by 6:00 pm

Everyone is to help clean the area as they check out. We need everyone helping to clean the area, so everyone can finish quickly and enjoy the fair.

HORSE & COLT

Horse changes will be discussed and made at the July 19 meeting at 6:00 pm in the Expo. Club fair assignments will also be done at this time.

On Thursday, August 10 after Showmanship has finished, the arena will be open for riding horses for 15-20 minutes per rider. However, each horse and rider must be accompanied by their guardian or horse leader. It is important to know that this is for "easy" warm-ups. Due to the potential for high traffic, there will be no patterns being run or loping.

MONTANAFAIR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE CHECKS

Sale checks will not be mailed until a Thank You Note to the Livestock Sale Buyer(s) has been written, stamped, and delivered to your Club Organizational Leader or a designated club leader. That leader will notify the Extension Office your Thank You have been received. Only when we the Extension Office has confirmation a Thank You Note has been sent, can your sale check be mailed.

An out of county participant will need to deliver or mail, your buyer Thank You (or notify via a phone call) to the Yellowstone County 4-H Agent, Roni Baker, to receive your sale check.

TIPS FOR THE MONTANAFAIR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE

- Start working with your animal early so you can safely handle it.
- Remember to work on getting buyers for your animal for the county Livestock Sale.
- Have the dates and times for events handy.

Ideas to keep in mind when marketing your animal:

The person's time is limited so have your sales pitch down pat. Call ahead and make an appointment, businesses are busy, and it is a courtesy to ask for time. Invite them to the buyer's lunch. Check with the Extension Office to see if they are on the buyers' list. Encourage them to check out the animals. The point here is that you ask the individual for support of the sale. If you pressure the person to buy your animal, it is likely you will alienate them as a potential buyer.

You have a quality product to offer at a very good price! Be sure to list those qualities. If there is time, share a summary of your financial journal and project book to show what you have done with your animal this year. Be sure to thank potential buyers for their time and support. It would be a good idea to follow up with a written note.

If a Buyer purchases your animal, remember to give them the buyer's picture at the sale or afterwards and include a personal thank you note!
