RE: Call for "Texts and Critics" Faculty Fellows 2020-2021

The Honors College is now accepting applications from those with demonstrated and effective teaching experience who are interested in serving as Faculty Fellows in our "Texts and Critics" seminar. If you would like to teach highly motivated students in a dynamic interdisciplinary arena, you are invited to apply for either the fall semester of 2019 (HONR 201US) or spring semester of 2020 (HONR 202IH). In the fall, our theme is "Knowledge"; in the spring it is "Imagination." Since individual sections of "T&C" meet at a variety of times, we will most likely be able to accommodate your schedule. Each Faculty Fellow co-teaches with an upper-division Student Fellow who has previously taken the course. All fellows are required to meet together on Mondays from 12:00-1:00 pm to discuss the texts. Compensation of \$4,500 for the semester enables departments to hire adjuncts to replace faculty who teach the seminar. If such instruction is in addition to a regular course load, the funds may be used as additional compensation or for departmental travel/equipment.

Class size is limited to 16 students, and discussions center on a variety of outstanding texts. Faculty Fellows who have taught "Texts and Critics" found the experience to be a refreshing change of pace and personally rewarding. Please discuss this potential teaching assignment in advance with your department head or chair. A selection committee will review the applications and invite finalists for informal interviews.
