TOUR FARM TO SCHOOL OF PARK COUNTY'S LINCOLN SCHOOL FARM Offsite - Livingston | Megan Randel

Join us for a tour of our Farm to School of Park County's flagship growing space! Located in downtown Livingston, the Lincoln School Farm is our main educational hub in the summer and also serves as a space for community engagement. The garden features eighteen rows of crops that are in annual vegetable production, a perennial permaculture garden that includes fruit trees and native plants, a small greenhouse, pollinator habitat, a vermicompost bin, and a shade structure. All the food grown at the

Lincoln School Farm is used to supply Livingston Public Schools with fresh produce for school meals. We will tour the garden, discuss our growing techniques and how we developed the space, and we will get to do some harvesting and snacking from the garden!

Join educators from Gallatin Valley Farm to School to explore ways to incorporate hands-on education into your farm to school program, whether or not you have a school garden. We will tour the Chico Hot Springs Garden, visit GVF2S's mobile greenhouse bus, Bob, and explore the nature of Chico while modeling a variety of farm to school lessons and activities that meet learning standards while connecting kids with local

foods. We'll discuss ways to meet learning needs and strategies for adapting to the place you're in and the materials and environment you have.
