Course Description: Teaching/learning principles are integrated into nursing education in academic or practice environments. Students practice, observe, and evaluate teaching/learning processes. The instructor and student negotiate laboratory activities.

Course Objectives:

At the conclusion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate appropriate teaching competencies.
- 2. Integrate personal philosophy of education into teaching activities.
- 3. Apply teaching and learning principles.
- 4. Evaluate outcomes in the teaching/learning process.
- 5. Use appropriate evidence as a basis for teaching practice.
