3. How Data Were Collected

a) How were data collected? (Please include method of collection and sample size).

Department head gathered final exam grades from instructor of record for PSCI 230/250 (Fall), PSCI 240 (Spring), and PSCI 210 (Spring). No data were collected from PSCI 210 in the fall semester as students were not required to take the final exam due to procedures in place due to COVID.

He then computed the average major grades in each course to determine if outcome was met.

Senior exit surveys were administered by Department Head via Qualtrics for all graduating seniors (majors and minors). Graduating seniors were provided with Qualtrics link by Department Head prior to graduation certification meeting. 40 students completed the survey out of 43 students graduating (93% completion rate).

PSCI 390R final papers from spring and fall semester were gathered from instructor of record by Department Head. 5 papers chosen at random from fall course and 5 at random from spring course by the instructor. Fall enrollment was 22, spring was 15.

b) Explain the assessment process, and who participated in the analysis of the data.

Senior exit survey and final exam grades were compiled and analyzed by Department Head.

Assessment of 390R papers according to the rubric was done by Eric Raile and the Department Head independently. The Department Head then compiled and analyzed the results.

4. What Was Learned

Based on the analysis of the data, and compared to the threshold values provided, what was learned from the assessment?

a) Areas of strength

PLO1: Demonstration of Disciplinary Knowledge

Department has achieved PLO thresholds with our majors achieving a grade of 75% or higher in the final exam (or other cumulative assessment) in across all six classes assessed (PSCI 230/PSCI 250 (fall and spring); PSCI 240 (Spring); and PSCI 210 (Spring)).

PLO2: Analytical and Critical Thinking Skills.

Department achieved PLO thresholds for Senior Exit Survey questions on analytical skills and research skills (scores of 2.0 or less on both).

Department achieved PLO thresholds for analytical skills and research skills on the 390R final paper (no student rated unacceptable).

PLO3: Technical and Applied Skills

Department achieved threshold values of 2.0 or less on senior exit survey questions pertaining to career goals and writing skills.

Department achieved PLO thresholds for technical and applied skills 390R final paper (no student rated unacceptable).
